## I. COURSE DESCRIPTION

## II. GRADING POLICY

# **Quarterly** grades will be determined as follows:

## 1. **HOMEWORK** (20%):

Homework will be assigned 3-5 times a week to ensure practice of the material. In addition, all work handed in must follow the "Criteria for Credit" as outlined below.

#### CRITERIA FOR CREDIT

a. All work must be turned in at the beginning of class on the date that it is due.

## Late work will ONLY be accepted for an excused absence.

- b. Any homework not turned in at the beginning of class on the day that it is due, will be a **ZERO!!**
- c. All work is neat and organized.

Any completed homework may be reworked after school to improve understanding and grade!

#### 2. **QUIZZES** (20%)

Quizzes will be given at least once a week. They may be announced or a surprise.

## 3. TESTS (20%)

Tests will be given at the end of each chapter.

# 4. LABS AND PARTICIPATION (20%)

- a. Each part of the curriculum listed above will correlate to an appropriate laboratory procedure to enhance learning and understanding. Each student <u>MUST</u> follow the list of laboratory rules (**see last sheet**) to ensure the safety of each student.
- b. Laboratory procedures may also include a lab report or summary, when necessary.
- c. Each student is expected to fully participate in each lecture, discussion, and laboratory procedure. Failure to do so will result in a poor participation grade.

#### 5. PROGRESSIVE EXAM BINDER CHECK and PREPARATION (20%)

- a. *A 1.5 inch, three ring binder (with dividers) is <u>required</u> to contain all materials given out in class along with dated notes, quizzes, tests, homework, and plenty of lined & graph paper. Each notebook will be checked and graded during each quarter as a Progressive Exam grade. In addition, the teacher will use her discretion to complete <u>UNANNOUNCED</u> binder checks.*
- b. Students are expected to be prepared for class daily. Being prepared means having your *binder*, *notes*, *homework*, *paper*, *textbook*, *pen and/or pencil* for every class.

## IV. ATTENDANCE/ TARDY POLICIES

In order to learn effectively and efficiently, students must be present in the classroom. Only students with excused absences will be allowed to make up missed work.

#### A. ABSENCE PROCEDURES
